SCHOOL CHAPLAIN REPORT

School History 1978 Planning a Centenary

John H. (Ern) Best [1978-1981] had a capable team behind him. To compensate for the restricted space, Assistant Principal John Murray and Chief of Staff Tom Carboon took the children on "a vigorous program of games in school periods and between" (Payne, 33). Tom Carboon was also involved with centenary planning as a school representative. Promote Whittlesea Council and the Whittlesea Agricultural Society transformed any modest plans the school had to mark the occasion into a major celebration for the wider community.

The picture collection below shows 1978 school life with the large photo revealing how school assembly took place on a fine day. The building beside the pupils is the 1959-1969 complex of classrooms and offices. Right at the back, connected by a covered path plus steps, is the new 1975 building in its third year of use. 383 pupils were enrolled, taught by Ern Best and his fifteen staff.



Whittlesea State School No 2090 opened its doors on September 1, 1878, and the centenary celebration was set for Saturday, August 19, 1978. Donations were called for to help cover costs and these could be forwarded to the school office. One young schoolboy handed 20 cents from his money box to office secretary Mrs Rosemary Hall "for the school party". To help raise money, there were four different school centenary glasses for sale to represent Eden Park, Humevale and Glenvale that amalgamated with the Whittlesea School. It was suggested that different coloured name tags be used to represent the four schools to make it easier for past pupils to recognise each other, but I don't know if this happened. Art teachers from Whittlesea Technical High School organised a display of present-day pupils' artwork at the art gallery opposite the primary school for that weekend. Large school centenary signs were provided free of charge to display about the town. Tom Carboon was on the committee that planned the Centenary Ball next door in the Christ Church hall for the evening of August 19.

That day there was to be a reunion of past-pupils in the morning and then a parade through the town to the school where a roll call would be taken before the cutting of the Centenary Cake.
