

#### **COLLECTIVELY CARING FOR CLIMATE PROJEACT- WHITTLESEA PRIMARY SCHOOL**

Throughout the beginning of Term 2, our Year 5's and Year 3/4 students were asked to be involved a project through the Whittlesea Council. The Collectively Caring for Climate project aims to raise awareness about climate change and how people can individually and collectively help to mitigate its effects. The project aims to empower participants to take committed climate action through art.







The students were asked to make a personal climate pledge, reflecting one small change they would make in their daily lives, that would help the environment. They were supplied with a small canvas to make an artwork that captured their climate pledge. More than 200 City of Whittlesea residents have participated in the project.

The artworks will be reproduced as prints on footpaths and collective murals. They will be installed throughout the municipality in public spaces such as streets, shopping strips, outside leisure and community facilities, along walking trails and other pedestrian areas.







There will also be an online gallery and exhibition of the artworks in the Great Hall at Council offices, with dates to be announced when COVID-19 restrictions are eased.

We are very proud of our students and their commitment to helping our environment. Thank you to Annette Carle, one of our WPS parents who was heavily involved in making this project happen!



#### **History of Netball**

**Netball** landed on **Australian** shores in 1897. And it wasn't long until demand grew for one, national organising body. The origins of **Netball Australia** technically began on 26 August, 1927, during an interstate women's basketball carnival. Back then it was known as the All **Australia** Women's Basket Ball Association.

Netball was introduced to Australia from England, and began its rapid spread through the country. Start of 20<sup>th</sup>century – Netball became established and widespread throughout Australia. 1924 – Interstate competitions began.
