### School History 1998 – Heritage Place

In gaining grants for the Masterplan projects (Heritage and school upgrade) Yvonne Scott had the full support of Marie Tehan. Without her input, the school community may not have obtained such a significant upgrade. A total of \$1,139,120 was granted to the school through Marie Tehan's diligent effort.







On June 25, 1998, the original 1878 school building and 1901 addition were added to the Victorian Heritage Register as a 'heritage place', a culturally significant place. (Heritage Register number 1717). Two Heritage statements follow:

"Whittlesea Primary School No. 2090 is of social and historical importance as an example of a school build in response to the 1872 Education Act which gave access to a free, compulsory and secular education. It has important associations with the Yan Yean water scheme which brought workers and their families to the area during its construction and consequently children to the school."


"Whittlesea Primary School No. 2090 is of architectural importance as an example of the Developed Designs Caulfield type school. It is unique as the only example of this type with an attached residence. It is important as it has had little alteration in its form since its construction and retains its original floor plan. It has strong associations with architect Henry Bastow who left a huge legacy to the State in the form of hundreds of schools of every type and size. Bastow was attached to the Education Department from 1873 until 1883."

Heritage Victoria provided \$179,000 towards this historic building restoration project. The building was in a very poor state of repair and these funds were used to convert

the old building into the main administration centre for the school.

Principal **Yvonne Scott** noted that: "The original bluestone steps have been worn away by the tread of many youngsters over the last 120 years."

### 2022 Foundation Transition to School


From Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> November the 2022 formal Foundation Transition program commences.
