Hello everyone,

We are still awaiting the return of all our Year 3/4 students, but all other year levels have been onsite this week and we can't wait for November 5th when all students are back full time.



There are exciting events to look forward to and some important information for all parents to be aware of. Please note the following key topics: -

Mental Health in Primary Schools Pilot in 2022

We are very excited to announce that our school will be involved in the Mental Health in Primary Schools Pilot in 2022. The MHiPS Pilot is a Victorian Government initiative, designed to promote a whole-school approach to mental health and wellbeing. The Pilot is being delivered in partnership with Murdoch Children's Research Institute and the Melbourne Graduate School of Education.

The Pilot provides our school with funding during 2022 to employ a teacher-qualified professional as a Mental Health and Wellbeing Coordinator who will assist to lead a whole-school approach to mental health prevention and early intervention approaches that are embedded in the classroom. This will enable us to further deepen our current practices to support our students' wellbeing.

The Mental Health and Wellbeing Coordinator will complement the school's existing wellbeing team and strengthen our connections with broader Department Education staff, local community services and other health professionals to engage and build relationships with appropriate mental health and wellbeing supports.

Book Week

As mentioned previously, our school will proceed with a dress up day to celebrate Book Week and a love of literature. Students are invited to attend school in costume on November 15th. Please start making plans now and we look forward to our students enjoying a great day.

Most noticeably, please be aware that the school will no longer purchase bulk supplies for all students and collect an excursion levy. For 2022 onwards, families can purchase a box of supplies through a preferred supplier. These materials are specifically selected for each year level and will be available for collection in late January before school commences. Each child will have their own personal materials from now on – meeting a key COVID safe practice expected of all schools. In regards to excursions, these will be charged throughout the year as teams plan experiences.






SCHOOL CHAPLAIN REPORT

Work was underway converting **Woods Paddock** into an attractive sporting field with a large viewing area slope. The contractor was **Australian Sporting Surfaces**.

The **SRC** Student Representative Council first fundraising for the year was for Green Aid Relief which supports needy children locally, nationally and internationally, through selling packs of band aids to raise the funds.

In sport, WPS won the District Swimming this year (February 18) at the Northcote Pool. All competing students progressed in at least one even to the Whittlesea Division Final a few weeks later. On Tuesday February 26, Bryce Gibbs and Jarrod Waite from the Carlton Football Club shared with year 5 & 6 students what it was like to be an elite athlete and then gave them a football training session. School House Swimming was Friday March 15 at the Whittlesea Pool (picture below). Twilight House Athletics followed this Thursday March 21. It was a busy term for sport.





For fitness, the Ride2School Day was organised for Friday March 22 (picture above). Students started at Walkers Reserve with Police escort and teacher supervision. This year, the ride, scoot, skateboard, or walk involved 150 students. Senior Constable Tim Forster spoke at the special school assembly following this in the gym and students each received a Stokes Orchard apple. For an additional fitness initiative, families were encouraged to become involved in the Premier's Active Families Challenge, to register to do 30 minutes of physical activity per day for 30 days starting from Monday March 4 and going right into the holidays.

Real turf was planned for these holidays for bare patches on the Oval, supplied by **Green Acres Instant Lawn**. Synthetic grass was planned for the cricket pitch.


