It was such a shame to miss our Twilight Sports event during the week. With the showers throughout the morning and the forecast of a high probability of rain throughout the afternoon and evening we needed to make the decision to cancel the event which we were all looking forward to. As it is late into the term we will need to look ahead to other opportunities. Our school is currently planning our whole school House Athletics Carnival at Meadowglen Athletics Track on April 30th. At present, there are no issues in proceeding with this public event and we are liaising closely with the COVID team within the Department of Education and Training. The venue has their own COVID plans and with the easing of restrictions, the event should be able to proceed as we have in the past without major modification. That said, should there be any change in COVID restrictions the event may be required to be changed or cancelled on short notice. Fingers crossed this great celebration of our PE program can progress and our students can have the opportunity to represent their house through athletic competition.

Due to COVID restrictions, our planned activities for the curriculum day scheduled on April 19th (the first day of Term 2) are unable to proceed as planned. We have, however, opted to designate this day as an opportunity for our teachers to host learning conference with all families. In the past we have held 'Meet and Greet' sessions and with disruptions this term these haven't be able to proceed. We feel that learning conferences at the beginning of Term 2 will provide an opportunity for parents, students, and teachers to come together for a targeted conference based on student achievement, learning goals and future directions. Each conference will be 15 minutes in length and involve student voice with children participating actively. In Term 3 our second opportunity for learning conferences takes a more student led approach, with the children driving the meeting through presentation of their achievement.

include the fence line along Plenty Road and the staff carpark. Thank you to Annette Carle and Amber Argote for their work last Friday.




If you are available during these times, you will be able to meet our specialist teachers and gain insights and ask questions about the learning programs for each year level.


SCHOOL CHAPLAIN REPORT



School History 1993 – Master Plan 2

In these first few years of Principal **Yvonne Scott** (1992-1998) much was being planned. Woods property had been purchased and its old weatherboard building was soon to be demolished. Funding was being sought for three separate building projects. One application was to Heritage Victoria for upgrading the old schoolhouse and head teacher's residence. The building was in an advanced state

of decay and it was essential to implement remedial works before irreparable damage occurred. The old brick kitchen at the rear of the building, added in 1915 (pictured below), was starting to fall down and it was found to have very little foundation under it. Yvonne Scott agreed that it had to be demolished and a new veranda constructed in its place.





Another grant application was for the construction of the large gymnasium, staffroom, music room, library and canteen. This was a significant part of the Master Plan, fully relying on the acquisition of Woods Paddock. A third application for funds was made for upgrading the 1968 and 1974 classroom complexes and these two similar projects were combined to achieve economies of scale.
