It is exciting work and over the coming weeks teachers will be implementing new and targeted strategies to shift achievement in these areas. You too can play your part in student learning. The establishment of literacy skills is not something that just happens at school. Reading TO or WITH your child every night is a pivotal strategy. Not only are you modelling a love of literacy, but there are teachable moments that you can identify in every text. If the book contains rhyming words – highlight this and challenge your child to identify more rhyming words to those in the text. All

### ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL REPORT

Hello everyone,

Have you booked your child's student learning conference yet? Booking times are still available for next Tuesday and Wednesday afternoon. Please access your child's profile in Compass to book your learning conference. If you find you are unable to make any of the available times, please email your classroom teacher via Compass to make an alternate time or call the main office.



This week our spelling focus was Rule 6 - the letter **i** cannot go at the end of English words and so the letter **y** takes its place. So why does the word 'ski' end in an **i**, you might ask?

Well, not all words are English in origin. The study of the history of words is known as Etymology. The word 'ski' is Norwegian, from Old Norse 'skith' meaning 'billet, snowshoe'. Another common word ending in i, 'aioli' is French in origin, from a combination of the words ai (meaning "garlic") and oli (meaning "oil"), making both the word and the food literally a mashup of garlic and oil.

Students have continued to practice their spelling words at school every day this week. Please encourage your child to practice at home every night after school, this should take no longer than 10 minutes. Every Monday our Literacy Learning Specialist, Sam McCormick, will post sample videos demonstrating the explicit teaching of these words. Look out for our next spelling rule, word list and video demonstrations next Monday.

Do you need additional uniform items but find it hard to get to Northern Regional Uniforms during the week or Saturday mornings? 




