#### ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL REPORT

Hello everyone,

Thank you to all of our families for attending student learning conferences with your children earlier this week. For varying reasons, we know that some of you were unable to make a conference time. Please contact your child's teacher via Compass to make an alternate time over the coming week.

Some of you may have noticed that the Compass parent app has been upgraded. The hamburger icon that brought you to the old vertical menu has been replaced with a new horizontal navigation bar at the base of the dashboard that displays key icons across the bottom of the screen - Home, Schedule, Attendance Notes, Shortcuts, Notifications and More.



The 'Shortcuts' button on the navigation bar is a new feature to give you quicker access to important actions, such as 'pay for an event' or 'report absence'. A direct route to get where you need to be! The 'More' button on the navigation bar will take you to a similar menu as the old one. Modules will now be sorted according to which ones you use the most, allowing for a more straightforward navigation.

Over the past two weeks we have practiced two whole school DISPLAN drills. These practice drills are routinely conducted in line with our school emergency management plan and are required by the Department of Education. The whole school evacuation, conducted last week, was a simulated response to potential dangers such as structural fires or a bushfire. The second evacuation this week, a lockdown, was a simulated response to a danger in the yard, for example, a kangaroo. Prior to each evacuation, our teachers talk to the students about what to expect so they are well prepared. Each procedure lasts for no longer that 5 minutes. Staff have the opportunity to provide feedback to ensure our DISPLAN procedures are effective in the event that we would need to enact one at any time.

'Every child deserves a book'. You may recognise this catch cry from Scholastic Book Club Issue 1. On Wednesday, your child brought home Issue 2 and it has some great bargains. Throughout each issue, you can purchase books for as little as \$3.
