PRINCIPAL TEAM REPORT

Hello everyone,

This week our regular timetable was adapted to allow teams of teachers to meet and plan uninterrupted for a day. This privileged time gives our educators the opportunity to develop units of work, analyse group data, plan assessments and consider how they will meet the needs of all students throughout the upcoming term.

This week we also welcomed back four past students, Caitlin, Ruby, Mathew and Cooper who are currently completing Year 10 at Whittlesea Secondary College. They have been supporting across various year levels throughout the week while completing work experience.

Earlier this year, school council endorsed a Cadbury Freddo and Friends fundraiser for Term 2. This year, the money raised will go towards the purchase of two new flag poles, to be installed alongside our existing flagpole. The new flagpoles will fly the Australian, Aboriginal flag and the Torres Strait Islander flag. We are aiming to have this project completed by the end of Term 2.
