Congratulations and well done to our Year 3 and 5 students who completed their NAPLAN testing this week. For the first time, our students completed these assessments online and it was certainly a different experience. In particular, the Year 5 writing test required the students to type their piece directly onto their BYOD laptops. Students were supported in the lead up to this week by completing similar learning tasks in an online environment. While being a key standardised measure of achievement, these tests form part of a broader assessment of student achievement. School reports distributed at the end of the term will give a more thorough summary of progress and future goals.



I am happy to announce that whole school assemblies are returning. A schedule of two assemblies per term has been created, with the first to be held this Monday morning. It will be great to have all year levels together in our gym once again. Unfortunately, the space is limited and an open invitation to parents is not possible.
