This project has been sent out to contractors for final submissions and the plans are ready to be carried out. This work will hopefully be completed over the coming months. Our final project, and the biggest, is our toilet redevelopment. This is only in the early stages and may still be many months away from completion. All three projects are significant improvements to our great school.


