

Over the first semester the school has used class splits regularly to manage high absence rates and a lack of replacement teachers across the state. In today's newsletter I thought I would quickly summarise why class splits are a better approach in many ways:

- Student learning continues with a neighbouring class where the teachers have planned consistent programs
- Students have a relationship with their teacher and can continue with normal routines

- Higher than normal absences allow the creation of normal class sizes




EMOTION COACHING - HELPING KIDS WITH BEHAVIOUR & EMOTIONS




An introduction to a style of parenting called Emotion Coaching. This can help your child to become better equipped to manage their emotions and engage in behaviour that reflects this regulation.

Jessica is registered with the Australian Health Practitioners Regulation Agency (AHPRA) with endorsement in Clinical Neuropsychology and is a member of the Australian Psychological Society (APS).
