

ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL REPORT

Hello everyone

At next Tuesday's school council meeting, we will table two policies for review and approval. The first is the Student Dress Code Policy (formally school uniform policy). This policy has been updated to include the new uniform items as we transition to our new supplier, Academy Uniforms, in Thomastown. The second policy for review is the **SunSmart policy**, which has been updated by the Department. It now stipulates that all staff and students **must** wear hats when playing or learning outdoors from



mid-August. From next Wednesday 24th August, all students **must** wear their WPS logo school hat outdoors during breaks, at PE and when learning outside.

Please take some time over the weekend to ensure your child's school hat is in their school bag. The office has a small supply available for purchase for \$16. Students without a logo school hat for outdoor play will be asked to play under the shade shelters.

On Tuesday, students across F-6 watched a performance by the crew from 'Backflips Against Bullying'. The performers engaged the students through acrobatics and parkour to deliver an evidence-based program, carefully tailored to meet key learning outcomes that align with the Australian Curriculum and complement various descriptors in the focus areas of AITSL Australian Professional Standards for Teachers. The program is supported by Evelyn M Field OEM, respected psychologist, and author of the Australian school's handbook to anti-bullying 'Bully Blocking'. In addition to this, Backflips Against Bullying is a registered **Trusted E-Safety Provider** with the Australian Government.

Our Year 1/2 students have been very busy over the past few weeks preparing their actions for their inquiry expo last night. Students prepared a design brief and created dioramas of their proposed improvements for the Whittlesea township. Students were given the opportunity to share their learning with their peers and again with their families after school. Some of their ideas included a footy oval with a grandstand, a zoo, a planetarium, a wishing well and a train station. Well done to all students that presented their learning and to the staff that supported the students to bring this event together.

Congratulations to students that participated at the Whittlesea Division Athletics yesterday. Albeit a bit chilly and windy, our students went above and beyond, displaying

our schools' expectations by Doing Their Best to Help Others Succeed. The team were so successful they won the event overall, which is outstanding.

2022 Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey

WE WANT OUR PARENTS/CAREGIVERS/GUARDIANS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents/caregivers/guardians think of our school. The Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behavior, and student engagement. We encourage all families invited to participate in this survey. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

A random sample of approximately 30% of parents/caregivers/guardians have been selected to participate in this year's survey.

The Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey will be conducted from **Monday 15th August** to **Friday 16th September.**

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **20 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Vietnamese, Simplified Chinese, Chin (Hakha), Hindi, Japanese, Somali, Turkish, Punjabi and Greek



Backflips Against Bullying Incursion







This week all students were involved in a whole school excursion focussing around bullying. The incursion was a fast-paced interactive combination of acrobatics, parkour, role plays and targeted conversation. The Backflips Against Bullying Program is supported by bullying expert and psychologist Evelyn M Field. The Program runs over a three-year cycle and builds on from the content covered each year.

The incursion focussed on a number of themes including:

- Empowering the bystander
- Exit Strategies for the Victim
- Deliberate Social Exclusion and
- The Consequences of Retaliation.

In 2018 the Education Council of the Council of Australian Governments endorsed the following definition of bullying for use by all Australian schools:

Bullying is an ongoing and deliberate misuse of power in relationships through repeated verbal, physical and/or social behaviour that intends to cause physical, social and/or psychological harm. It can involve an individual or a group misusing their power, or perceived power, over one or more persons who feel unable to stop it from happening.

Bullying has three main features:

- It involves a misuse of power in a relationship
- It is ongoing and repeated, and
- It involves behaviours that can cause harm.

Our comprehensive Bullying Prevention Policy can be found on our school website. The policy outlines bullying prevention strategies in place at our school and how incidents are responded to.






UNIFORM SALES



Bring Your Own Device Program Overview

Whittlesea Primary School is continuing to have great success in building a digital rich learning program which is supported by the 1:1 BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) initiative. Students in Years 3-6 take part in the program where students use their personal computers during regular classroom activities. The BYOD program gives students and teachers opportunities to have a dynamic program which balances traditional offline tasks with a range of digital learning activities that reinforce core concepts as well as equip students with practical, future-ready skills.

Teachers and students leverage a rich online learning environment through the Department of Education's endorsed software package; *EduStar*. By implementing the full range of Microsoft365 applications for education, teachers continue to provide high quality lessons, facilitate personalised feedback, and collaborative conferences. Having a personal device that travels with the student each day, further strengthens the connection between home and school, capturing student learning in a digital portfolio.

In 2023, we will once again partner with EduNet to support the BYOD program. EduNet is an Authorized DET Supplier of digital technologies for Schools. Devices are delivered to the school, pre-loaded with all of the software that students need to be successful in their learning, including; software, network, internet and security settings.


