We are using our \$4,900 grant for our excursion to CERES. CERES is an environmental education centre, community garden, urban farm and social enterprise hub spread across four locations, linked by the Merri and Darebin Creeks on Wurundjeri Country, Melbourne.

The visit aligns perfectly with our school's inquiry learning that aims to foster authentic learning experiences for our students. Across Foundation, Years 1 & 2, our students inquire into sustainability and the needs of living things including people, plants, and animals. They build on their understandings of the physical world and learn about how to care for the natural environment. Through these inquiry units, students develop a deeper understanding of their role as citizens in maintaining a healthy environment. CERES and its education programs provide the ideal educational setting, with opportunities for learning that align closely to our school curriculum and build on the rich experiences our students have already relished.

The Victorian Junior Landcare and Biodiversity Grants are funded by the Victorian Government through the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning. They contribute to the targets of *Protecting Victoria's Environment – Biodiversity 2037*, the Victorian Government's plan to stop the decline of our native plants and animals and improve our natural environment.



A big thank you to the staff and students for an amazing camping experience last week. I had a great time on the 5/6 City Camp and enjoyed seeing our children get so much out of the amazing experiences on offer.



## SWPBS at Whittlesea Primary School School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS)

At our school we have clearly identified Major and Minor behaviours. Minor behaviour forms our core business and students are supported to turn their behaviour around and return to learning. Staff explicitly teach the expected behaviours through a series of class meetings, role play, discussions, and modelling. SWPBS artefacts are on display in all areas across the school and staff refer to these to help pre correct behaviours and remind students of the expectations.


A behaviour flowchart ensures consistency with how minor and major behaviours are addressed. Staff use the following strategies to help students be ready for learning and re engage in the task. These can include:

- Restating the expected behaviour
- Referring to the behaviour matrix
- Allowing time for a behaviour change
- Offering an alternative solution, relocation, make up lost time
- Provide an opportunity for self regulation
- Suggest a 3min calm down time

Major behaviours are considered as being of a more severe nature and may require support from our leadership team. Major behaviours may include a logical consequence, working in another area, family contact or a more serious consequence dependent on the situation.

#### Major and Minor Behaviour

The Chart provides a common interpretation of all Major and Minor behaviours. Staff refer to behaviours as being as either major or minor when first redirecting a student and supporting them to make an informed choice to correct their actions.
